

2013 Recap of BTEA Ministry Activities

January

- Two-week project in Makati City
 - 19 Americans preached in 39 schools
 - Attendance: 75,687 Decisions: 74,852

February

- Two-week project on the Islands of Camiguin and Siguijor
 - 10 Americans preached in 145 schools
 - Our staff also blitzed the islands and conducted 182 film showings
 - Attendance: 46,193 people Decisions: 41,338 (schools and film showings)
- Mr. Tebow and Pastor Stone went to Khon Kaen, Thailand to conduct training for a small group of pastors from Thailand and Laos. These men have been selected to help launch our ministry plans in these two countries

March

- 9 Americans visited South Asia
 - Visited rescue girls, orphans, and the Bible school
 - Observed the progress of the safe house
 - Worshipped with local believers

April

- Annual Staff Conference in the Philippines

June

The rescued girls were able to move into the training building, while awaiting the completion of the main house.

July

- On our 20th summer project, we sent teams to Metro Manila (Quezon City), Bohol, and Sibugay
- The team of 91 Americans preached in 1,551 schools to 699,751 people with 676,833 people making public professions of faith in Jesus.
- The team distributed hundreds of thousands of tracts to reinforce the gospel message and to give the new believers a tool to share their faith with friends and family.
- The team also transported clothing, shoes, sheets, towels, Bibles, toys, and equipment for the orphanage and Filipino staff.

August

- Annual Homecoming Celebration Lunch in Jacksonville, FL
- The rescued girls moved into the main house, while interior work was being completed.
- Mr. Tebow and Pastor Stone made a brief visit to our South Asia partners

- Mr. Tebow and Pastor Stone spent three days, training six men to work as full-time evangelists for BTEA in Laos.
 - We have begun supporting four of these men and hope to add the other two men within the next year after they finish up with other responsibilities.
 - Three of these men have been preaching without support since our training in March.

November

- Mr. Tebow will travel to the Philippines to meet with the Filipino staff, visit the CURE Hospital in Davao, and see the orphans at Uncle Dick's Home

There are currently 28 children living at Uncle Dick's Home. Seven of these are attending college, with three of them preparing to graduate.
